About CB VET

Capacity building projects are international cooperation projects based on multilateral partnerships between organisations active in the field of VET in:

- EU Member States
- Third countries associated to the Programme
- Third countries not associated to the Programme

CB VET projects aim to support the **relevance**, **accessibility**, **responsiveness** of VET institutions and systems in third countries not associated to the Programme



Objectives

- Build capacity of VET providers to strengthen cooperation between private and public stakeholders in VET for demand-oriented and opportunity-driven VET interventions;
- Improve the quality and responsiveness of VET to economic and social developments to enhance the labour market relevance of skills provision;
- Align VET provision to local, regional and national development strategies.

- Developing and transferring pedagogical approaches, teaching and training materials, including work-based learning, virtual mobility, open educational resources and better exploitation of the ICT potential

Sub-Saharan Africa

- * least developed countries; migration priority countries; no country will access more than 8% of funding foreseen for the Region;
- * respective geographic <u>Multi-annual Indicative Programmes</u> at country or regional level. <u>EU-Africa Global Gateway Investment Package</u>.
- * public-private dialogue between VET institutions and the private sector.

Latin America

- * regional projects (projects involving more than one eligible third country not associated to the Programme) or projects in lower and upper middle income countries;
- * respective geographic Multi-annual Indicative Programmes at country or regional level.

Caribbean

- * regional projects (projects involving more than one eligible third country not associated to the Programme) or projects in least developed, lower and upper middle income countries;
- * respective geographic Multi-annual Indicative Programmes at country or regional level.

To keep in mind!

ATTENTION: WHO CAN BE APPLICANT/COORDINATOR?

- Any public and private organisation active in the VET field and legally established in an EU Member State or eligible third country associated to the Programme.
- Organisations from third countries not associated to the Programme cannot be coordinators.

NOVELTIES:

- Cross-regional projects are not eligible.
- "Multiple submissions" are now possible (one organisation can submit more than 1 application)





Usually you could expect selection results in July-August. If selected, contracts are signed until November.



Financial mechanism – Lump Sum Type II

- Funding rules are set in the <u>Erasmus+ Programme Guide</u>
- EU grant is maximum 80% of the estimated budget.
 - Maximum EU grant: 400 000 EUR
 - Minimum EU grant: 100 000 EUR
- 20% Contribution from sources other than the EU grant (own resources, financial contributions from third parties or income generated by the project)



LUMP SUM - Type of costs, basic documents and rules



- 2. Annotated Model Grant Agreement
- 3. EU grant is maximum 80% of the estimated budget.

 Maximum EU grant: 400 000 EUR
- 4. 20% Contribution from sources other than the EU grant (own resources, financial contributions from third parties or income generated by the project)



- 5. Use actual costs for all type of costs (estimation)
- 6. No percentage limits (for costs categories A, B or C)
- 7. Recommendation:
 Prepare your total budget
 with all actual costs and
 then transfer it
 to work packages with
 lump sum system. You
 will do it with the help (if
 need be) of calculating an
 average amounts of
 actual costs



What makes a good project?

- Consortium composition (including players in VET, world of work, decision makers)
- Clear needs analysis (for the region/countries, for your partners, for your participants)
- Realistic impact (explaining what will your project change in VET, concise objectives)
- Concrete outputs and deliverables (clearly supporting capacity in VET)
- In line with policy documents and regional priorities (see Programme Guide)
- Balanced EU grant (rememeber: focus is on third countries not associated to Programme)



Feedback from our monitoring (I)

- Projects which have done an impactful Needs Analysis have a more focused/easier implementation
- Projects which deliver impact for the learners are particularly of interest for Feedback to Policy
- Impactful deliverables (rather quality than quantity)
 - · Reporting Periods (RPs) are contractual obligation and do not need deliverable on it
 - Milestones in between month 1 18 and 20 36, to accomplish the RPs



Feedback from our monitoring (II)

- Communication/Dissemination/stakeholder engagement starts as of day one: cover it in the proposal and 2-3 deliverables accompanying the implementation.
- Partner constellations: Big consortia are more difficult to manage; those consortia which manage to establish already at proposal-stage a thorough and detailed collaboration have it easier in the implementation.



How to find coordinator/partner





Finding coordinator/partner - Try different ways

1

If you already have contacts with VET providers in EU or third countries associated to the Erasmus+ Programme, get in touch with them to check if they plan to apply under this action.

- 2. Contact **European networks** of VET Providers (e.g. EVTA, EVBB, EfVET, EUproVET) and networks that represent higher education institutions also active in the field of VET (e.g. EURASHE, EUCEN).
- 3. Organization active in **lifelong guidance**, **counselling**, **learning mobility and career management** contact the European network **Euroguidance**.
- 4. Involve other organizations from your country make your project stronger.
- 5. Involve other organizations from **other countries of the same region** it might be they have contacts to organizations from EU/third countries associated to the programme.

In this context, you may consult the ETF regions and countries.

Useful tips



- √ Be coherent: avoid contradictions and "cut and paste" style applications
- ✓ **Be concrete:** use examples, justify your claims, provide evidence
- ✓ Be clear: read the questions carefully, provide information in the correct order as indicated in the form
- ✓ **Be explicit:** take nothing for granted; don't assume that experts have prior knowledge; avoid abbreviations or explain them
- ✓ **Be realistic:** the application is the basis of your project to be; it is also the cornerstone of the commitment you will sign
- ✓ Remain focused: concentrate exclusively on what is asked of you
- ✓ **Eligibility:** make sure you have followed all instructions and that the proposal meets all mandatory requirements
- √ Keep it simple: use short sentences, vary the length if you wish to make it more interesting but keep it simple and focused
